t's not often that we have the opportunity to feature a local world record breaker in the *BT* but Bardfield Girl Hatty Carder with her amazing team Wavebreakers has broken a world record becoming the fastest female trio to row 3000 miles across the Atlantic from La Gomera in the Canary Islands to Antigua, described as 'the world's toughest row'. The team of three, Hatty, Bobbie Mellor and Katherine Antrobus spent 40 days and nights at sea surviving tumultuous storms, seasickness, sleep deprivation and a capsize. Despite the setbacks they persevered, winning the race and setting a world record of 40 days, 10 hours and 51 minutes. We congratulate them on their fantastic achievement. Wavebreakers are fundraising for two charities: WWF's Climate Crisis Fund which runs programmes to defend wild places, restore forests and keep oceans healthy, and UNHCR's Climate Crisis work providing humanitarian relief to refugees displaced by the climate crisis today. 

elle Kirby (née Rickwood) was born in Dunmow Road, Great Bardfield on March 26th 1924. A few years ago Anna Bass interviewed Belle for the *BT* at her then home in Rayne. Belle has since moved to Kilkee

Lodge Care Home, Braintree, where on our recent visit she showed us a photo of a group of Bardfield School students taken in 1938. They were all about to leave school, as they did then, at 14. Belle identified all the girls and was happy to tell us where they all lived. She is quite amazing! Many of the family names recorded are familiar of course - Piper, Bucknell, Coxall ... there will be a few BT readers who will recognise them. She remembered too Miss Duffield, Headteacher, and Mrs Dunell and Miss Mary Adams as teachers. She also remembers that the photo was taken outside Kathy



Mumford's house next to the school, which, today, is called 'Mumfords'.

After leaving school Belle went to work as a Nanny for a family in Great Saling and later as a parlour maid at Little Bardfield Hall. It was a delight to meet Belle and hear her memories We send congratulations to this 'Bardfield Girl' as she celebrates her 100th Birthday.

Great Bardfield Parish Council report

Three Fields Pan-Parish Meeting

In February, members of Great Bardfield Parish Council attended a meeting hosted by our District Councillors, Michael Staines and Mark Ault, for all parishes in the Three Fields ward. Representatives from Finchingfield, Wethersfield, Shalford and Panfield also attended. We discussed issues that affect us all and how we may, as a group, have more influence on some issues.

Subjects covered included traffic and highways maintenance, the Wethersfield Airbase and its potential long term use, tourism, and relationships with Braintree District Council and Essex County Council. Further information from this and our latest Parish Council meeting are provided in this report. It is planned that this forum will continue as it a useful means of connecting and communicating with our neighbouring parishes.

Wethersfield Airbase Update

The Home Office have recently provided local councils with the latest information about the use of the airbase as an asylum centre. Though the base has accommodation for, and permission to, house up to 1500 residents, a current cap of 600 has been set by the Home Office. We understand that as of the end of February 550 asylum seekers are living at the base. Increased security and welfare officers are being appointed. Local church groups and other volunteers are also providing some support. The Home Office have applied to extend the use of the base for accommodation of asylum seekers for 3 years.

At the Pan-Parish meeting some concern was raised that the base was still under consideration for the development of two prisons, however since that meeting, we have heard from Cllr Staines that this is no longer the case and that Wethersfield is no longer listed as a possible prison site by the Ministry of Justice as they have been granted permissions at other locations. There is potential for the site to be reconsidered for this or other uses in the future.

Planning Applications

- 10 Durham Close, conversion of garage plus single storey rear and side extensions: The Parish Council did not object to this application but did ask for sufficient sound proofing materials to be required, neighbours' comments and concerns to be considered and also stressed the importance of ensuring appropriate development in the Conservation Area.
- 25 Northampton Meadow: tree works. No objections

UKPower Works at the Playing Field

These works were to replace overhead cables with cables laid underground

and also to continue beyond the playing fields. They have taken some time to be completed though we understand this is nearly done and that the car park will be tidied up and recycling backs reinstated in their previous position. These works had nothing to do with our Pavilion build but were planned works by UKPower. Even so, we apologise for the muddy nature of the entrance to the playing field during the last few months. Hopefully as Spring arrives, we will be able to enjoy the playing fields and playground without so much mud.

Highways/Pavements

Having complained multiple times we have been advised by Essex Highways that work will soon (?!) take place at the exit of the village on the Finchingfield Road. This will involve the replacement of broken drainage pipes that have been causing much of the flooding in this area, and then the repair of the road. We do not yet know if this will involve a complete road closure.

The repair of a broken manhole cover in the High Street has been outstanding since December 5th despite continuous chasing. Openreach, who are responsible for its replacement, have assured us that this will be undertaken shortly.

Bus 16

Following a complaint raised by the Parish Council that some drivers were missing the stop in Brook Street, the bus company has confirmed that all drivers on this route have been reminded to follow the correct route and not to turn up Vine Street.



GREENFINGERS

AIN RAIN! That was our Winter. Perversely, this month Greenfingers suggests how to plant up that most awkward of all areas in one's garden – dry shade. Now this is a common request for help in garden magazines so off we go as we explore how to make it more attractive. with Greenfinger's imagination in top gear. If it is under trees think of a woodland so improve the soil with moist composts, home made and leaf mould are best. Go for bulbs here with a few suitable plants. In Spring any bulb will do well as the light will come through as trees are leafless.

Bulbs for later are the expensive Lilies Martagon, but easy and cheap to buy, the Asiatic hybrids Enchantment is orange but Cinnabar is red. All cyclamen will do well.

Plants: common old Vinca, the periwinkle creeps along in the choice of blue or white or plum coloured. Epimedium has attractive heart shaped leaves, but cut all leaves off now so sprays of yellow flowers are on show. Obvious are Digitalis, the foxglove. Around shrubs all the above plus my best choice:

Geranium Nodosum and the widow Geranium Phaeum. Heuchera, the plant of the moment i.e. loads available. Coloured leaves from lime green, orange to purple with speckled in between, these would look great 'stabbed' with the Lilies as above. Plant Euphorbia Griffithii as it has brilliant orange bracts in late Spring, Fireglow is the one to have. Yes to foxgloves, written above plus honesty e.g. Lunaria, common in purple but special in variegated white and the taller Corfu Blue. Let seedlings of foxgloves and honesty survive where fallen to flower the following year.



Exciting shopping for you and if not to your taste just place large pots of acid compost and keep moist with only rain water. 'What's in them?' you ask: Camellias, so glamorous!!

From the Vicarage...

ne of the most important ways in which we cement our relationships is by eating together. There's something about sharing one of our most basic human activities with other people which deepens our connection to one another. This is something we know and care about in church, and which takes on a special significance as we approach the celebration of Easter, which falls this year at the end of March. The events we remember at Easter had one of their beginnings with a shared meal in a now famous 'upper room' in Jerusalem. Here, Jesus' sharing of bread and wine with his followers had such a profound significance that we still repeat it Sunday by Sunday some two thousand years later.

This year, our events for then include a showing of the film 'Babette's Feast', in which the idea of a feast giving rise to profound changes in relationships is explored. Nature Notes - Birds of Prey

have always enjoyed seeing the birds which visit my bird table, they are not only entertaining but since I lost my faithful dog Jill, I have come to realise that in a small way they are also company and I have started to take much more notice of them. That is possibly what has made me realise that I have more than one stranger mixing very happily in with the great tits and blue tits which seem to have



bottomless tummies as they seem to be feeding all the time. The strangers are in fact nuthatches and although they blend in quite well their markings and the colour of the plumage is very different; they also have longer beaks. Rather than trying to describe the differences I will attach a picture. The nuthatch is a woodland bird which is found in deciduous woods in most parts of England and Wales almost up as high as southern Scotland. There is also an Asian specie which has different markings and a red or yellow beak. Nuthatches are the only birds which can run down a tree as easily as they run up. As the name suggests they are fond of nuts and their main food is eech and hazel nuts and acorns which they store for winter but they also feed on other kernels, seeds, berries and insects. They have a very clever method of dealing with nuts. They jam the nut into a crack or crevice in a tree and peck a hole in the

shell to get to the kernel. Their favourite work bench often has a small pile of empty shells under it. This clever way of dealing with a nut is what earned them their original name which was a 'nut hack' which later became nuthatch. They breed in late April early May and nest in holes in trees or nest boxes. If the entrance hole is too big they build it up with mud which sets rock hard. The bottom of the nest is lined with fragments of wood bark and bits of dried leaves. They lay six to nine white eggs which are boldly marked, especially at the large end, with red to purple blotches. The hen incubates the eggs on her own and incubation takes about two weeks: both parents feed the chicks. Considering the fact that the nuthatch is a completely separate species to the tit family it is





amazing that they have so much in common and they are quite happy sharing the food on the bird table and in fact feeding at the same time. Another feature they have in common with one of the tit family, the long tail tit is they are both communal roosters sleeping together in cold weather to keep warm.





For example, in St. Peters, Ugley we are told on one board that Robert Bucke, a draper, in his will of 1620 gave 3 suits of clothes to 3 poor men and 3 suits to 3 poor women with hats, to be given every third year "for ever".

Just a few miles away in Manuden's parish church, a board describes three benefactors, one of whom is the same Robert Bucke. Here he gives the same number of suits to the poor

In Little Hadham the church of St. Cecilia has a board recording that Miss Ann Scott, in her 1865 will, left dividends to the rector and church wardens to distribute bread on Shrove Sunday each year "at their discretion" to the poor of the Parish.

Hatfield Broad Oak's Church of St. Mary the Virgin has a brass plaque describing the generosity of John Gobert. He left £600 in his will of 1623 for the purchase of land, the proceeds from which were to be distributed in a variety of ways including £4 per annum to the town of Hatfield Broad Oak. His heir Sir John Barrington subsequently bought the manor of Keeres in Aythorpe Roothing to comply with the will.
