# **Great Bardfield Parish Council Report**

#### **Parish Council Vacancies**

By the time this report is published we will have started the cooption process to fill the two vacancies for Parish Councillors on the Great Bardfield Parish Council. We thank all those that expressed an interest and really appreciate your willingness to support the community. The appointed Councillors will hopefully be in place for our next full Council meeting in September.

#### **Travellers at Playing Fields**

Around 10-12 caravans arrived on the playing field site on Thursday 19th June, having accessed a secure gate, and were reported by the Parish Council as soon as informed by a resident. An eviction notice was served on them early on Friday morning and they had left the site by Monday 23rd June. The police Rural Engagement Team and Essex Country Travellers' Unit were involved, visiting the site daily. There were some reports of noise nuisance and branches taken from neighbouring residents' trees to fuel a bonfire which damaged the football pitch. The police have recorded these incidents of criminal damage.

The Parish Council thanks the village handyman, Ian Ruffle, for his prompt clearance and reinstatement of the field following the group's departure and we are now looking at ways to provide additional measures to restrict access to the field.

# **Housing Needs Survey**

The Parish Council have appointed the Rural Community Council of Essex (RCCE) to undertake a Housing Needs Survey for the village. It is a few years since we last undertook such a survey and this will inform us of current needs to see if there are gaps in provision of appropriate housing and will help inform future decisions on development and housing requirements. Further information is provided in this magazine and survey questionnaires will be distributed at the end of August/early September. Volunteers would be appreciated to help us stuff envelopes and/or distribute them to every household. # **Planning Applications**

Local Plan Update – Call for Sites. A representative of Great Bardfield Parish Council spoke at the Braintree District Council's planning meeting on 19th June to oppose development at three sites within the parish, put forward for inclusion in the updated Local Plan. It was agreed by BDC's planning committee that these sites will not be accepted for inclusion.

- Springfield House, Braintree Road: revised plan to demolish the
  existing property and build new. The PC informed the planning
  authority that their ongoing concerns about the property's design
  remain unaddressed in the new application.
- Barn Rear of Bell Cottage (now named Moomin): reduction in size of a previously approved outbuilding. No objection.
- Paul's Farm, Little Bardfield Road: this cross-boundary application for commercial units has replaced that previously withdrawn. It was agreed that the Planning Committee would consider this application following the meeting as the details had only just been received.
- Tree works at Ethel House, High Street: no objections.

# **Historical Society**

#### The visit that brought History to Life

In late June, 20 members of the Great Bardfield Historical Society made a memorable visit to Ickworth House, the Italianate

National Trust property in Rotunda. Suffolk. Our visit was to build on our recent historical society talk that explored the life of one of its former residents, Lady Molly Lepel - Molly's position at court, her wit and charm and her marriage into the powerful Lady Molly Lepel later Hervey family. became known as Mary Hervey, Countess of Bristol.

Now. walking the house and grounds of Ickworth, we were able to Emily Deal, our guide experience the living context of her story,



and we were delighted that Emily Deal, who had presented her PhD studies about the life of Lady Molly Lepel to us in October 2024, once again joined us and led our visit.

In our group discussion outside the imposing Rotunda, Emily reflected enthusiastically with us, how the building encapsulates the world of art, learning and intellectual debate which Molly Lepel participated in during her years at court and at lckworth.

One of my highlights of the visit was the Ickworth Library, a quiet and atmospheric room, where archives have shown Molly to have spent many hours reading and writing letters to friends and family - her letters offering glimpses into the emotional and intellectual life of this extraordinary woman. By visiting the spaces where Molly Lepel lived, we were able to bridge the gap between biography and space and was a perfect complement to Emily's previous talk.

We had the most enjoyable day, sunshine and picnicking together but also with a warm welcome and sharing of Emily's expert knowledge. We are looking forward to planning future visits.

We started with a glass of wine or elderflower cordial and had a very warm welcome from Neil Birks. Neil gave a short talk about the history of *NB Flowers* which was followed by a tour of the field to see the wide variety of

English roses growing there. There were about 40 different varieties – a lovely range of colours – all with a scent. The roses are picked early morning on Sundays and Wednesdays and taken straight to New Covent Garden Flower Market. The florist business is based above the market.

# From the Vicarage...

veryone loves an anniversary (indeed, with wedding season well underway, it's also a season for anniversary celebrations!). In the Church, because we've been around for a while, anniversaries often come with large numbers attached, but this year marks a big milestone, even for the Church. It is 1400 years since a group of bishops met in the city of Nicaea (now Iznik in modern Turkey) at the request of the Roman Emperor Constantine. The reasons that this meeting is still remembered (amongst the many, many meetings of bishops which are not!) are, firstly, that it was the first attempt to gather representatives from the whole of the Christian Church in one place; and secondly, that the bishops agreed the first version of a text which (with a few later modifications) continues to be recited together by congregations across our churches Sunday by Sunday.

The 'Nicene Creed', as this text came to be known, is a summary of several of the most important Christian beliefs – it affirms belief in God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, about God the Son taking on human nature in the person of Jesus Christ, the significance of the events of Jesus' life, and the purpose of the Church as a community in which we come to share eternal life. By its very nature, talking as it does about the nature of God which we believe to be the greatest of all mysteries, it is a text which can still inspire and challenge even after many years of recitation – which is true both for individuals, and for the Church as a whole. There are not many texts which have been sources of such inspiration over such a long period of time, which is testament to the power of these words as a statement of faith.

They can also be a challenge; I remember one wise and faithful Christian who once said that, on a good day, he could just about get as far as the end of the first line, 'I believe in one God,' but he took seriously the promise of faith which the words represent, and strove to grow into it. I also remember reciting the Creed myself at age 10, as a member of the choir, and being excited and fascinated by some of the words which I hadn't encountered in any other contexts, and being hungry to learn more about what they meant. The

Church of England has recently produced a series of short reflections examining the Creed line by line, which are available on its 'Everyday Faith' app (<a href="https://cofe.io/EverydayFaithAndroid">https://cofe.io/EverydayFaithios</a>), which might be a way for you to discover something about these words, and their power to provide meaning to explore for a lifetime.

Add alstroemerias to this mixture and they were the stars of this show for me.

Now is the perfect time to buy and plant because:

- 1. In flower so buyer chooses the colour.

- 3. August gives them time to get settled in, a mulch of bark at the end of October and they will be bigger next summer,

Yes, they are perennials, yes a wide selection of colours and like sun or partial shade. And what a 'Wow' in your garden mimicking the stunning scheme at this hotel. Three plants coming my way this week.

#### **ACTION FOR AUGUST**

- Buy alstroemeria but add anemones and aquilegias to your trolley, the former for autumn flowering and the aquilegias for spring, as one is planning for coming seasons.
- Scatter seeds of poppy, foxglove and nigella if you want a natural look next year.
- Forget buying bulbs till 6 or 7 weeks' time but concentrate on cutting off faded flowers, cut down to the ground those like geraniums and catmint and ladies' mantle that have finished their display.

So 'A' was for August and 'A' for a fair number of recommended plants and now Adieu till true Autumn, the BT October issue.

# Harvesting

Elsie James' booklet 'Bardfield Memories,' a quick word about Pipers Store in Bridge Street where Elsie's family, the Pipers, ran a general store. In Piper's meadow by the bridge they kept four or five cows, and sold milk during the First World War. Elsie's mother made butter in a dairy at the back of the house and kept free-range poultry and pigs. On the other side of the road was a five-acre market garden, stretching from the river along to the Vine Meadow behind the houses in Bridge Street right up to Northampton Meadow. There were green houses for grapes and tomatoes and one heated with hot water pipes from a coke fire for propagating seedling plants. There were nearly a hundred fruit trees and an acre of soft fruits – gooseberries, strawberries, raspberries and currants. Elsie remembered the local women who came in their pinafores to pick blackcurrants for her father.

The following extract comes from Elsie's account of harvesting in the early 1930s.

'Barley, wheat, oats and some rye, were the corn crops on our arable land. There was always some excitement in the air when we heard the horses and binders going along the street to the cornfield for the reaping. Some, of course, went straight to the field from the farm. It was a long day's work and sometimes the binder-twine broke and there was a stoppage for repairs. Each bundle of corn was automatically tied, then fell off the back of the binder. There would be a halt for elevenses and the horse given a drink and a nosebag. Then back to work, and excitement would build up as the last stand, the middle of the field was left. This was where all the rabbits congregated, as the horse and binder came nearer and nearer. The terrified rabbits rushed out and made for the field perimeter chased by the shouting boys who cracked skulls. The dogs joined in, killing and retrieving the families' prospective dinners.

The next job for the harvest gang was the propping up of all the sheaves, into stooks of several bundles and leaving them for wind



Scything by hand - cutting barley at Great Lodge C1904 and sun to dry the straw and corn, before it was finally gathered in.

When the day arrived for the 'harvest home' the great shire horses or the breed called Suffolk Punch, drew the wagons to the harvest field. The sheaves were pitch-forked up, and taken to the stack yard. It was a skilled job. Two men stood on top to receive the heavy sheaves, tossed off the two-pronged forks, to place each in a compact level. Next the threshing tackle arrived – steam engine, conveyor belt and other paraphernalia. This time the boys and dogs were alert for rats and mice which had been having a bonanza on the corn stacks! The lads stood around with their sticks and the dogs straining at the leash as the stack dwindled and the corn grains were bagged up. The threshed straw would be re-stacked for winter bedding for the livestock.'

At the end of harvest there would be a merry Harvest Supper or 'horkey' as it was known in East Anglia. 'Boiled beef, or perhaps rabbit pie, was served, washed down with ale or cider. Plum pudding was always on the menu, and bread baked in the shape of an ear or sheaf of corn.'

by King Henry VIII, the Hundred Parishes area had its fair share of religious houses – monasteries, convents, abbeys and priories. The remains of some can still be seen today.



Tilty Parish Church

Tilty Abbey is one. It was founded for Cistercian monks in 1153 and prospered mainly due to the wool trade before being dissolved. In 1220 a chapel was built outside the abbey gates for use by visitors. The chapel survives and today functions as Tilty's parish church. Little remains of the other abbey buildings but the site can be visited; interpretation boards inform the visitor and give an artist's impression of how the site would have looked.

Little Dunmow Priory was founded in 1104 and was home to Augustinian monks until the Dissolution. Most of the priory church was demolished but the southern aisle survived. It is now used as the parish church.

Several of our larger hospitality venues were developed on sites of former religious houses: Hanbury Manor in Thundridge was

once Poles Convent. Down Hall in Hatfield Heath evolved from a 14th-century monastery, while Leez Priory in Felsted became the home of Richard Rich through his leading role in dissolving the monasteries.

In Saffron Walden, Audley End House was built on the site of Walden Abbey, founded in the 12th century and whose lands were granted in 1538 to Sir Thomas Audley, Henry VIII's Lord Chancellor. The present house was built some 60 years later by his grandson Thomas Howard.

While we tend think οf religious houses as a bygone era. Pleshev has one that is relatively new and active: its House of Retreat was founded as a convent in the early 1900s

and became the first Diocesan Retreat House in England in 1927.
