The Thunder Bolt air crash article in the October Bardfield Times, had stated that the school pupils were led to the Anderson Shelter, by Mrs Dunell, in fact, the Anderson Shelters were for families and would have held up to six family members.

As you stand with your back to the Jubilee Oak, the Shelter was built on the left-hand side of the school and had 9" solid brick walls and a 6" concrete roof which was waterproof, there were no windows, they had benches to sit on, and it had electric lights. This shelter was large enough to hold all the pupils and from memory it was demolished in the 1960s.

### **Great Bardfield Primary School**

t's hard to believe how much we've packed into the term already since returning in September! At Great Bardfield Primary School, we're proud that learning extends far beyond the classroom. Alongside the daily teaching and learning, we place great value on providing our pupils with a wide range of enrichment opportunities and experiences. These moments not only make school life exciting and memorable, but also help our children develop confidence, resilience, and the skills they need to thrive as positive, well-rounded members of their community and the wider world.

Earlier this term, our Key Stage Two children had the incredible opportunity to visit the excavation site of a World War II plane crash. In January 1944, a P-47 Thunderbolt crashed nearby during a training flight, tragically claiming the life of 2nd Lieutenant Lester Lowry. The excavation, led by a team from Cotswold Archaeology, was working to recover the pilot's remains so that he may finally be

returned home to his family and laid to rest with honour. Our children were fascinated to learn about the process of archaeological investigation and even had the chance to sieve the soil like real archaeologists. We feel very fortunate to have such rich and meaningful history right on our doorstep—Great Bardfield is always full of stories from the past, but this discovery has truly brought history to life in a remarkable way.


develop their sporting abilities, try new activities, and enjoy healthy competition with children from other local schools.

### **Firework Night**

### Remembrance Day

The Parish Council will be laying a wreath to remember those residents of Great and Little Bardfield who died during the two World Wars and other conflicts. This will take place at the service organised by St Mary's Parish Church on Memorial Green on Sunday 9<sup>th</sup> November at 3pm.

### **Housing Needs Survey**

Thank you to everyone who responded to the Housing Needs survey. The Parish Council currently awaits the results of this survey, which will inform us on the local need, if any, for specific types of housing.

### **Planning Application**

Friends' Meeting House, Brook Street – reduction of the boundary wall - no objections provided the conditions set by the Historic Buildings Officer are met.

Shorthorn Grange, Bushett Rise – new stables – no objections provided neighbours' views are taken into consideration.

Treeworks at 4 The Corniche – no objections.

### Local Plan Update - Call for Sites.

We understand that Braintree District Council's Planning Committee determined that the sites put forward for development at the former RAF Wethersfield airbase and at Andrewsfield/Blake End will NOT be allocated for development under the Local Plan. At the time of writing the minutes of these meetings were not available so we are waiting for further information about these decisions. Large-scale development of these sites would certainly have impacted on our village in terms of local infrastructure and services.

### **Asset Management**

The Parish Council are currently putting together a full listing of all village assets, such as benches, bins, streetlights etc, to enable us to monitor and maintain all items in a planned manner.




### **Bardfield Cinema Club**

### The Tuesday Club

The speaker for our October meeting was Sheila Hasler, who spoke to us about her life while living in Dominica, a small Caribbean country sharing the island of Hispaniola with Haiti. Dominica was so named by Columbus, who discovered it on a Sunday!

Sheila went to live in Dominica in 1964 as a newly-wed, when her husband was sent there to cultivate and oversee the 'lime estate'. If you have ever bought a jar of Rose's Lime Marmalade the fruit may well have been grown there, as the country still has an annual output of over 82,000 metric tons! Dominica is known as the "Nature Island of the Caribbean" and has no less than nine volcanic areas, not bad for an island only 29 miles long and 16 miles wide. Sheila and her husband lived there for eleven years, and she had many memories and anecdotes, together with photos, including bathing in Champagne Bay, so called because of the small gas bubbles which rise continuously from the volcanic sea floor.

Dominica is of course now the Dominican Republic, after gaining independence from the United Kingdom is 1978. It is a thriving holiday destination, although at present there are no direct flights from the UK. A new airport is now being planned which would give direct access, so increasing tourism. At the same time new homes are being built which will only be available for the Dominican people, so hopefully a balance will be maintained.

We will be welcoming back Will Edwards to our next meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> November, for a talk on "What Happened to Harry?" Harry was Will's great uncle, who went to fight in WW1 and never returned home. This was all that Will knew about Harry and he wanted to know more, so set about researching what had happened to him. This should prove to be an intriguing talk, not only to hear Harry's story, but also for anyone who has an interest in looking into their own family history. If you aren't a member of the club we would be pleased to welcome you to our meeting on 11<sup>th</sup> November. Visitors pay £5 including refreshments, doors open at 2.00 and meetings start at 2.30.

### **Local People: Janet Dyson**

ecently I had the opportunity to interview a lady that I have heard described as 'Mrs Bardfield'. Janet Dyson earned this title for her varied and dedicated contribution to our village since moving here nearly 50 years ago; taking leading roles in the Parish Council, the community bookshop 'Between the Lines', as editor of our much loved BT,



as Director of the Community Choir and as Govenor of the Primary School. She is a member of the Historical Society, frequently runs tours of the village and she has published a number of books about the village and 'The Bardfield Artists'. She is committed to ensuring that the community has the best possible access to essential services, whilst preserving the characteristics of Great Bardfield and its important cultural and historic heritage.

Janet lives in one of the two 'Blue Plaque' houses in Great Bardfield; Brick House, where she was interviewed about the house recently by Michael Portillo for his BBC2 series *Great British Railway Journeys*. Naturally she was the first stop for Sandi Toksvig and her team, when they came to investigate the WWII plane crash site just outside the village.

Janet is an academic, researcher and writer. During her time in the village she has become increasingly interested in the lives and work of the artists of Great Bardfield.

Janet, I understand you took on a new challenge during covid lockdown? Yes, I bought Brick House when there was no one to tell me not to! The blue plaque is for artist Edward Bawden, who, with his wife Charlotte and their two children lived in Brick House from the 1930s. The house was a wedding present from Edward's father. Edward initially worked in the studio in the attic, which looks out over the rooftops of the village towards the church, until the 1950s when a studio was designed for him and built


onto the back of the house. The larger studio enabled Edward to have much larger pieces and also other artists worked with him there.

We have some of Edward's work in the village?

Absolutely, we are very fortunate to have in The Bawden Room, 14 of the 16 original sketches for the King Penguin book 'Life in an English Village'. And they are the most precious possessions that Great Bardfield has; Edward gave them to the village and we have been able to display them, along with work by other 'Bardfield Artists'.

[The Bawden Room is open Sunday afternoons from 2.00-4.00pm, from Easter to the end of September, or on request; it can also be booked by visiting groups - free entry.]

How does your love of history combine with living in Great Bardfield? Having previously written a book about the artists who came to live in Great Bardfield and being really interested in their lives and how they lived alongside the village people and the houses where they lived. When I bought Brick House, during Covid, I felt that I was somehow living in the story of Brick House and that it was a story that I wanted to tell. I kept a journal during that time, and the journal became a significant part of the story of my living in Brick House. In the book it's been interwoven with



In the book it's been interwoven with the history of Brick House and what we know about the lives of artists and the people who came to live there, people who came to stay and people who visited them. Over the period of time from the thirties until 1970 when Charlotte died and Bawden moved to Saffron Walden.

The book is called *Spirits of Place*, and is due to be launched on November 21<sup>st</sup>, perfect for Christmas presents. It is edited by Jenny Rooney, with artwork by local artist David Meldrum.





scorching weather over and new season begins but shall we talk of summer success and failures or anticipate autumn? Let's do both!

### **Past**

Naturally the best survivors οf summer the were plants of Mediterranean origin, gaura with masses of white 'butterfly' flowers. All of the salvias (mostly Gaura 'butterfly' flowers South American) and



any annuals. Cosmos are always reliable and now are available in different colours and petal formation. Must mention semi shrubs, silver of the artemisia, the poisonous castor oil plant Ricinus produces red

'balls' loving the heat. Lemon scented leaves of verbena, great as a tea or simply rub the leaves for the citrus smell and all forms of euphorbia. Grasses, annual perennial and are simply fabulous, in particular love the red foxtail seed heads of this grass, proper name Setaria is an annual but having it last year it has popped up everywhere. Not a nuisance as so easy to pull out but where it is left to perform. It was a 'statement' in a pot with red geraniums as well as in the border swaying in the breeze.

Brakes on my writing now as failures need to be mentioned. Phlox were the saddest plants unless you gardeners watered more often than I did and had them growing in the right position. Poor Blue Paradise suffered in the west facing site, too hot, too dry and yet the stunning variegated leaf Norah Leigh with pink flowers loved the weather. Needless to say, unless in shade and deeply mulched with wood chipping, ferns withered.

### **Present**

- A little late but worth a try, take cuttings of gauras and heaping compost or wood chipping around those in the garden just in case severe winter arrives.
- 2. Same with salvias, although many are not hardy anyway, e.g. popular Amistrad
- 3. Gather seed of your favourite cosmos and keep dry for April 2026 sowing.
- 4. Setaria the red foxtail grass will look after itself, dying and leaving seed lurking then when warm enough their babies 'hatch.'
- 5. Phlox, move to a semi shaded position and an excellent time to split the crown to have more.

### **Future**

Not winter yet. Start considering pots for winter interest, miniature tulips and daffodils, evergreen grasses, forget-me-nots, tempted by cyclamen even though unreliable in bad weather? When they collapse just whip them out and replace with primrose!

Hurrah to the hope of a new season!

### From the Vicarage...

ovember is a month traditionally associated with remembrance, which dates back beyond the era in which 11 November, marking the end of World War One, became a focus for remembrance of those killed in war. It's a tradition linked to the festival of Hallowe'en, which is the eve (-e'en) of All Saints' (or All Hallows', to use the old name for it) Day. All Saints' Day is a day on which the Church remembers those who have handed on their faith in past generations, by guiding, teaching and inspiring others to live as they did, but who have perhaps not become sufficiently widely known to have acquired their own named saint's day. And following on from that, All Souls' Day on 2 November became an opportunity to express a different aspect of our lasting connection with departed loved ones.

At the heart of the Christian faith lies the promise of eternal life, though exactly what that is like is a great mystery to us. However, when I talk to people who have lost a loved one about their hopes, what comes across most powerfully is usually not a fixed idea of what that person's life or existence looks like now, but about the sense they have of still being connected to that person. That connection is at the heart of what is celebrated on All Saints' and All Souls' Days; when someone is part of our family or community, and we pray for them, we're likely to find either that we're sharing in their joys or in their troubles. We express, on the one hand, our gratitude for the way in which the relationship we have with them enriches us, and on the other hand, our desire to see them finding wholeness and fulfilment.

Those two aspects of how we relate to other people remain alive and active even when the separation of death comes, and so when we hold our remembrance services for All Souls, we are showing how our care for them lasts beyond death, and extends across what separates us from them for a while. I hope that many of you will have the opportunity to come to one of our All Souls services (listed in the service schedule below) – you are welcome to request names to be read out of those you wish to remember, and to light a candle in memory – to join with others in showing how the bonds of love make remembrance about a relationship which is still very much alive and active.

ecently, I was privileged to watch two bats flying around my garden. They were so quick and acrobatic it was difficult to keep them in view. Bats and their roosts are legally protected so must not be disturbed. Bats are mammals, giving birth to live young. It reminded me of how lucky we



are in The Hundred Parishes to have so many wild mammals in our mainly rural area.

There are several kinds of deer locally, mostly Fallow, Roe or Muntjac. Larger herds are usually Fallow deer which have "palmate" antlers, shaped like the palm of a hand. The smaller Roe deer may be seen in smaller groups – they have a white rump and no visible tail. Muntjac are smaller still and tend to be solitary; they have horns and "tusks" - downward-pointing canine teeth.

Out enjoying our latest walk, number 188, my wife and I surprised two hares who disappeared at great speed when they spotted us. They can run up to 45mph over short distances.



We regularly see foxes in our garden, usually courtesy of our inexpensive night vision camera. In the spring, we enjoyed watching the young cubs playing. Foxes seem to be a more common sight now, even during daylight, and regularly venture into built up areas. The camera

occasionally spots a badger; he is usually looking for peanuts.

Anyone lucky enough to see hedgehogs in their garden should look after them as their numbers are in decline. They are nocturnal, so at dusk we should put out a shallow bowl of fresh water (not milk as it is bad for their digestion) and perhaps some dog or cat food. They may repay you by eating slugs and



insects although our experience has been that they prefer commercial hedgehog food like Spike's Dinner. Enjoy them all.
